Since 1990 I have been an independent, freelancing artist, except for the years 2008–2013, when I was Professor of Fine Arts in Aalto University. I'm also the chairperson of [The Artists' Association of Finland](#) and [IAA Europe](#).

I work in the fields of art, philosophy and politics by whatever means necessary. The results are usually some kind of visual art, literature, theater, film or theory.

For me art is the best way to respond to the questions:

"How should we live? Why should we keep on living? What is good life?"

Art is the most flexible, versatile and holistic form of philosophy and politics.

I've had 61 solo exhibitions, participated in about 250 group shows, written nine books and written & directed numerous theatre plays, films and operas.
